
AMERICANISM

- And White star represents those who have a close relative who served in the military and later lost them to suicide.


Tips & Tricks

- Be clear when you speak.
- Do not talk too fast.
- Pause at the end of a question so that you don't talk over the interviewer
- Smile and look interested.
- Sit up straight and have good body language.
- Keep up good eye contact look at your camera rather than at the screen.
- Make sure the microphone on your phone or camera is close enough to hear
- Test your phone or camera in advance to ensure it's working properly and you know how to use it.

- Ask about their favorite memorable moment(s).

 - Who stood out to you and whom did you admire?
- · Place emphasis on bringing the past to life.
 - · What do you feel is important to remember and let us never forget?
- If your Auxiliary has no legacy members, look to your District or Department.





Video and Photography Tips

- What to Avoid
 - Avoid closed eyes, open mouth, a mouth full of food, distracting objects in the picture (e.g. bunny ears, trees popping out of someone's head or from behind the body.)
- · People may pose in awkward positions
 - Tell them to be comfortable and relax this is going to be fun!
- Avoid any offensive language on clothing
 - T-Shirts, Sweatshirts, or Jackets
- · Get Close to the person you are interviewing
 - Being to far from the person can appear distant and uninviting





Video and Photography Tips Continued..

Lighting is Key

- If you are outside and the sun is shining, have the sun to your back.
- If you are inside, avoid windows and make sure there is enough light in the room.

Stabilize your Video

- Hold the camera as steady as possible. Many smart phones have optical image stabilization but do your best to keep the camera or phone steady.
- · A phone stand or tripod may be helpful.

Record in Landscape Mode

- Use landscape (turn the phone on its side) to get more of the subject in the frame.
- It's easer to watch on the computer and when I sent to National to maybe appear on the big screen at the National Convention

Many facilities have office type positions, assistance to the various departments, patient support, entertainment assistant and much more. Again, each facility is unique to

their individual needs and demands so being flexible is a plus.

HECK IT OUT!

Your volunteers can reach out to Recreation Therapy for the CLC (Community Living Center) to receive their on-going, updating activities and needs to help them carry out the

programs they provide for the Veterans in the "CLC". I do believe they allow visitors to come in and help with certain activities including Bingo (which is only on Thursday nights and with a limit of \$30.00 & 4 members to assist with Bingo).

You must go thru the Volunteer office to see what the current process is to volunteer in the CLC because it has been changing depending on current environmental status. Bottom line there are many ways to step up and "volunteer" whether as a registered volunteer, or as an Auxiliary looking to sponsor an activity or event. Be An Advocate-Be Informed-Be Engaged

September 2023 General Information

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Last month's general information provided an explanation of the legislative goals for the auxiliary. The most important for us to focus on is priority goals which focus on budget, health care, disability assistance, transition assistance, education, employment, military quality of life, POA and MIA. All of these areas are dependent on the legislation being introduced to improve said areas. One of the most crucial ways for us to support our veterans and their families is by voting on bills that will positively impact our military, veterans and families thereof. We can do this by educating ourselves on what bills will be brought to Congress that benefit our veterans and by understanding how the process works. Educating ourselves on upcoming bills is the easy part, all you need to do is join VFW's Action Corps Weekly. To understand how the process of how a bill passes, we first need to know how the legislative process works.

How is legislation introduced?

Anyone can introduce a bill to Congress. A bill is a legislative proposal to make a new law or amend an existing law. The catch is that only a member of the House of Representatives or Senate can introduce the bill to Congress. That is why who we vote in for legislators is so important, we want to vote in representatives who support the military, its veterans and their families.

The bill will be provided to the clerk of the house where a senate member must gain recognition of the presiding officer to announce the introduction of the bill. If the bill is introduced it is then referred to a committee by the Speaker of the House or presiding officer of the Senate. The committee that presides over the bill depends on what is included in the bill, it could possibly be split between committees. It is the committees responsibility to read, research, study and hear testimony from experts and people interested in the bill. The committee may then take three actions, it might: (1) release the bill with a recommendation to pass it; (2) revise the bill and release it; or (3) lay it aside so that the House cannot vote on it.

Lastly, as you all know we held our council of administration meeting on August 19, 2023 at the VFW post in Littleton, NH. It was an informative, educational and overall great day. Former Senator, Kelly Ayotte, who is running for Governor of NH was in attendance and mingled with both post and auxiliary members.

National Auxiliary Membership Dues Increase

National dues shall be ten dollars (\$10.00) per annum on each member, effective July 1, 2024, paid by ACH transaction to National Headquarters.

What does this mean for your Auxiliary? For each annual member on July 1st 2024 you will now send \$16.00 per member each year to the Department of New Hampshire. At this time Life Membership dues has not increased.

Adding younger members is essential to the future of the VFW Auxiliary. However, younger people often have hectic schedules, family obligations, and financial constraints that make it difficult to commit to local Auxiliaries. We need to make VFW Auxiliary membership more attractive and more feasible for younger members.

Here are a few ideas that Auxiliaries can consider to attract younger members to the organization:

- Reach out to current or past Scholarship winners/applicants to join.
- Create social and networking activities that are interesting and convenient for younger people. Encourage younger members to be involved in the planning of these events.
- Invite groups of younger people to join at the same time to make them feel more comfortable. Help them encourage their peers to get involved as well.
- Foster an Auxiliary environment that is accepting of occasional absences.
- Highlight monthly opportunities to get involved in local service projects.
- Assign a current Auxiliary member to serve as a mentor for the first six months to make a new younger member feel welcome.
- Get younger members involved from the start. Younger members are creative and eager to generate new ideas for solving persistent Auxiliary problems. Ensure younger members have a voice and a space to grow.
- Be open to the various ways that younger members can participate in your Auxiliary. Find out about their abilities and interests, and find ways to put them to good use in your Auxiliary's work.
- Incorporate youth-welcoming messages in all Auxiliary communications that begin with the assumption that younger members are important to the organization because they make valuable contributions, and they are needed at all levels of Auxiliary leadership.

Where will your donations help?

Homeless & Struggling Veterans in New Hampshire need our help! One of the big issues our Veterans have is paying for the out-of-pocket medical and dental expenses. These expenses include copays, deductibles, and expenses that are not covered by insurance. We all know exactly how expensive medications can be especially when our own insurance will not cover what the doctor has prescribed. Remember your recent visit to the Dentist and its time for a root canal or a crown? Dental insurance typically doesn't cover it all.

A special account has been created at Liberty House in conjunction with the VFW for a specific line in the ledger that will be used for those out-of-pocket expenses. Funds received for this Special Projected will be ear marked for this newly created account line item. Funds received will be distributed on as-need basis to a Veteran in need until the account is exhausted.

What is Liberty House?

Liberty House is an organization that provides substance-free housing and connections to various community services that help New Hampshire veterans transition to independence.

Community veterans: They regularly work with struggling or homeless veterans from the community, male and female, many of whom are on fixed incomes, providing them with assistance such as food, clothing, transportation (gas cards, bus passes), camping gear and community referrals. While our transitional living program only serves male veterans, support for our community veterans is open to both male and female veterans.

Illustrating America


Illustrating America is open to any student in grades K-8 by the March 31, 2024 deadline who is enrolled in a public, private or parochial school or home study program in the United States, its territories and possessions; or dependents of U.S. military or civilian personnel in overseas schools. Although U.S. citizenship is not required, students must be lawful U.S. permanent residents or have applied for permanent residence (the application for which has not been denied) and intend to become a U.S. citizen. Foreign exchange students and students age 15 or older are ineligible. National grade division winners of previous Illustration America contests may enter the subsequent grade division but are ineligible for the same grade division of which they are a previous National winner.



Entries will be judged on patriotic themes and technique. The contest consists of three grade divisions: K-2, 3-5, and 6-8. The Department first place winner in each grade division will be forwarded to Auxiliary National Headquarters.



There are National awards for first, second, and third place <u>in each grade</u> <u>division!</u> The first, second, and third place entry in each grade division will be displayed at the National Convention. Please see the student brochure and entry form in <u>MALTA Member Resources</u> or on the <u>VFW Auxiliary website</u> for more details on requirements and contest rules.
