Voting in any changes will only by delegate vote as per the By-Laws:

#### 40 Sec. 505— District Standing Rules

A. Districts may establish Standing Rules to provide for specified operations, activities, events, expenses and disbursements allowable between meetings provided such rules do not conflict with the National or Department Bylaws.

- Custom has the status of a Standing Rule.
- Standing Rules may be amended, modified, or rescinded at any meeting.
- 3. If prior notice is given, the vote is by majority vote of the Delegates present.
- If previous notice is not given, the vote is by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the Delegates present.
- Standing Rules become effective immediately.

## **VA NEWS**





Passage of the Sergeant First Class Heath Robinson Honoring our Promise to Address Comprehensive Toxics Act of 2022, known as the PACT Act. This historic, comprehensive legislation expands health care for generations of veterans who previously had to prove their conditions or illnesses were the result of service-connected exposure to toxic substances or environments. It includes VA provisions for 23 presumptive conditions for rare respiratory diseases and cancers, and creates a framework for the establishment of future presumptions of service connection related to toxic exposure.

Passage of the *Dr. Kate Hendricks Thomas SERVICE Act* expands eligibility for VA mammography screenings to veterans who served in certain areas during specific time periods, and the *Making Advances in Mammography and Medical Options (MAMMO) for Veterans Act* addresses provisions of mammograms and breast cancer treatment within VA.on related to toxic exposure.

Global War on Terrorism Memorial Location Act and Uniform Code of Military Justice reform on sexual assault and harassment included in the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2022.

Implementation of VA's maternity care coordination program to equip community care providers with training and support for the unique pregnancy and postpartum needs of women veterans.

Passage of the *PAWS for Veterans Therapy Act* which will establish a pilot program on dog training therapy for veterans diagnosed with PTSD and require VA to provide service dogs for those veterans, including veterinary insurance.

Inclusion of bladder cancer, hypothyroidism, and parkinsonism to the list of Department of Veterans Affairs presumptive conditions for herbicide exposure.

Passage of the *Deborah Sampson Act*, which will remove the barriers to health care impacting women veterans.

Elimination of the 12-year limit on using Veteran Readiness and Employment (VR&E) benefits.



# Battle of Passchendaele

The Third Battle of Ypres (German: *Dritte Flandernschlacht*; French: *Troisième Bataille des Flandres*; <u>Dutch</u>: *Derde Slag om leper*), also known as the Battle of Passchendaele (/ˈpæʃəndeɪl/), was a campaign of the <u>First World War</u>, fought by the <u>Allies</u> against the <u>German Empire</u>. [a] The battle took place on the <u>Western Front</u>, from July to November 1917, for control of the ridges south and east of the Belgian city of <u>Ypres</u> in <u>West Flanders</u>, as part of a strategy decided by the Allies at conferences in November 1916 and May 1917. <u>Passchendaele</u> lies on the last ridge east of Ypres, 5 mi (8 km) from Roulers (now <u>Roeselare</u>), a junction of the <u>Bruges</u>-(Brugge)-to-<u>Kortrijk</u> railway. The station at Roulers was on the main supply route of the German <u>4th Army</u>. Once Passchendaele Ridge had been captured, the Allied advance was to continue to a line from Thourout (now <u>Torhout</u>) to Couckelaere (<u>Koekelare</u>).

Further operations and a British supporting attack along the Belgian coast from Nieuport (Nieuwpoort), combined with an amphibious landing (Operation Hush), were to have reached Bruges and then the Dutch frontier. Although a general withdrawal had seemed inevitable in early October, the Germans were able to avoid one due to the resistance of the 4th Army, unusually wet weather in August, the beginning of the autumn rains in October and the diversion of British and French resources to <a href="Italy">Italy</a>. The campaign ended in November, when the <a href="Canadian Corps">Canadian Corps</a> captured Passchendaele, apart from local attacks in December and early in the new year. The <a href="Battle of the Lys">Battle of Ypres</a>) and the <a href="Fifth Battle of Ypres">Fifth Battle of Ypres</a> of 1918, were fought before the Allies occupied the Belgian coast and reached the Dutch frontier.

A campaign in Flanders was controversial in 1917 and has remained so. The British Prime Minister, <u>David Lloyd George</u>, opposed the offensive, as did General <u>Ferdinand Foch</u>, the <u>Chief of Staff of the French Army</u>. <u>Field Marshall Sir Douglas Haig</u>, commander of the <u>British Expeditionary Force</u> (BEF), did not receive approval for the Flanders operation from the War Cabinet until 25 July. Matters of dispute by the participants, writers and historians since 1917 include the wisdom of pursuing an offensive strategy in the wake of the <u>Nivelle Offensive</u>, rather than waiting for the arrival of the <u>American Expeditionary Force</u> (AEF) in France.

Remaining controversial are the choice of Flanders, its climate, the selection of <u>General Hubert Gough</u> and the <u>Fifth Army</u> to conduct the offensive, and debates over the nature of the opening attack and between advocates of shallow and deeper objectives. Also debated are the time between the <u>Battle of Messines</u> (7–14 June) and the first Allied attack (the <u>Battle of Pilckem Ridge</u>, 31 July), the extent to which the <u>French Army mutinies</u> influenced the British, the effect of the exceptional weather, the decision to continue the offensive in October and the human costs of the campaign.

Commander Matthew Snodgrass, USNR, Accepts Sea Command

Hampstead Post 11254 JVC Commander Matthew Snodgrass, USN Reserve Surface Warfare Officer (SWO), assumed command of a security boat company in the Maritime Expeditionary Security Force in a ceremony at Joint Expeditionary Base Little Creek-Fort Story on 6 September. He is one of only four Navy Reserve O-5 SWOs to command at sea in over a decade. Previously, the position was limited to O-6 squadron commanding officers.

Ted LeClair, deputy commander, Naval Surface Forces, also attended the ceremony and said, "We are laser-focused on identifying and delivering Navy warfighting capabilities that are best suited for the Reserve component. By adding these four SWOs to command at sea billets, we are showing our nation that the Navy Reserve is a part of our lethal and resilient force..."
