VETERANS DAY: The History and the Story of the Poppy.

Veterans/Remembrance Day - The History

In 1918, World War I ended on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month. The entire world celebrated. An armistice (a truce) was signed declaring the "war to end all wars" was finally over. The next year, on November 11th, the US called the day "Armistice Day" in memory of all the men and women involved in WWI. On Armistice Day, surviving soldiers marched in parades through their home towns. Politicians and veteran officers gave speeches and had ceremonies in thanks for the peace that had been won.

The Story of the Poppy - In Flanders Fields

Poppies, which are a bright red flower, became a symbol of Veterans Day after the bloody WWI battle in Flanders Field, in Belgium. The soil in the battle fields became scattered with rubble, making the soil rich with lime (the mineral, not the fruit). Poppies thrived in the fertile soil. Many soldiers were buried in Flanders field, creating a contrast of white crosses and vibrant red poppies. Major John McCrae was a Canadian surgeon who was moved by the sight of this, leading him to pen one of the most memorable war poems ever written - In Flanders Fields.

Where will your donations help?

Homeless & Struggling Veterans in New Hampshire need our help! One of the big issues our Veterans have is paying for the out-of-pocket medical and dental expenses. These expenses include copays, deductibles, and expenses that are not covered by insurance. We all know exactly how expensive medications can be especially when our own insurance will not cover what the doctor has prescribed. Remember your recent visit to the Dentist and its time for a root canal or a crown? Dental insurance typically doesn't cover it all.

A special account has been created at Liberty House in conjunction with the VFW for a specific line in the ledger that will be used for those out-of-pocket expenses. Funds received for this Special Project will be earmarked for this newly created account line item. Funds received will be distributed on an as-need basis to a Veteran in need until the account is exhausted.

A great example: I posted on a local Facebook page about the cookbook, I received a message from a local woman. "I don't really have any good recipes but would like to donate to Liberty House." She donated a TON of items including (Hats, Socks, Water Bottles, Deodorant, Razers, Shaving Cream, and Snack Bars.

What is Liberty House?

Liberty House is an organization that provides substance-free housing and connections to various community services that help New Hampshire veterans transition to independence.

Community veterans: They regularly work with struggling or homeless veterans from the community, male and female, many of whom are on fixed incomes, providing them with assistance such as food, clothing, transportation (gas cards, bus passes), camping gear and community referrals. While our transitional living program only serves male veterans, support for our community veterans is open to both male and female veterans.

Salute to a Veteran

When a Veteran has passed, especially in a hospital or Veterans Home, a family can request that their loved one receives this "showing of respect" brief ceremony for his/her service to their country provided the facility is able to carry it out. This is important and should be shared with all Veteran families to



make them aware.....hopefully the facility will remember to ask all patients and their families when they are admitted, this particularly important question:

Did you Serve?

"The Final Salute" for deceased veterans is a way to acknowledge their dedication and sacrifice in serving their country. It is a time to honor their commitment to protecting our freedoms and to express gratitude for their selfless contributions for their service.

The Honors Escort Program or as it is sometimes referred to as a "Final Salute" can show honor & respect for one's military service to his or her country. It is a tribute and a unique way of saying thank you to this Veteran that has now passed. Surrounded by his loved ones, or in some instances just staff, a short prayer is shared and then the American Flag now covers this Veteran as he is escorted from the facility with "Taps"



being played.....

Auxiliary members, our Mission at hand is to "*Challenge the Needs of our Veterans*" & their Families by "*Banding Together for Our Veterans*" and being the spokesperson to find out or put into place.....

- If the question is asked when a patient is admitted, "Are you a Veteran?"
- Would something of this nature take place based on current circumstances (i.e., covid protocols in place if in fact this patient is a Veteran and does pass while at their facility?
- Most facilities have some form of Clergy available that can offer a comforting prayer as the deceased is draped with the American Flag for his/her exit from the facility.

National Anthem A March 3, 1931 O say can you see, by the dawn's early light, What so proudly we hail'd at the twilight's last gleaming, Whose broad stripes and bright stars through the perilous fight O'er the ramparts we watch'd were so gallantly streaming? And the rocket's red glare, the bomb bursting in air, Gave proof through the night that our flag was still there, O say does that star-spangled banner yet wave O'er the land of the free and the home of the brave? On March 3, 1931, the U.S. Congress passed a joint resolution (46 Stat. 1508) making the song the official national anthem of the United States, which President Herbert Hoover signed into law. In recognition, National Anthem Day is celebrated each year in honor of the patriotic song that celebrates America's triumph and endurance. The song was originally a poem, penned by Francis Scott Key in 1814 with a different title.

Francis Scott Key penned his poem during a naval attack on Fort McHenry in Baltimore, on the Chesapeake Bay, by British ships during the war of 1812. As a result, Key watched the battle unfold in the pouring rain — and eventually, he was able to determine that the Fort's storm flag had survived the barrage and that by dawn, the larger revile flag was proudly raised. "He had witnessed Britain's 25-hour bombardment of the Fort, and for Key, the raising of the American flag was a triumphant symbol of bravery and perseverance." That is the image that inspired him to write the Poem. The poem was originally titled "The Defense of Fort M'Henry" and Key put the words to a familiar drinking song at the time, "To Anacreon in Heaven," written by British composer John Stafford Smith.



National Vietnam War Veterans Day is celebrated on March 29th.

National Vietnam War Veterans Day is a commemorative holiday in the United States that recognizes the sacrifices veterans and their families made during the Vietnam War. It is also a day to give proper recognition to the men and women who returned home from that war and did not receive a proper welcome. It has been celebrated since 1973 on either March 29th or March 30th of each year through a patchwork of state resolutions. However, in 2017, the date of the holiday was set as March 29th by U.S. President Donald Trump. This day is now officially known as National Vietnam War Veterans Day.

The Vietnam War was a divisive and difficult time for the United States, and many veterans did not get the recognition for their service they deserved, which is why commemorating this holiday is so important.

Let's try to recognize our Vietnam War Veterans on their day as well as teach our children the Star Spangle Banner and its history.

Shrink The Change

Here is a clever self-help technique that you can adapt and share with your Auxiliary members who may be hesitant about recruiting new members. It is called the "5-Minute Room Rescue," proposed by Marla Cilley, a home-organizing guru who calls herself the Fly Lady.

Here's what you do: Get a kitchen timer and set it for 5 minutes. Then go to the worst room in your house – the one you'd never let a guest see – and as the timer ticks down, start clearing a path, and when the timer buzzes, you can stop with a clear conscience.

While there's not much good in only 5 minutes of cleaning, it gets you moving, and that's the hardest part. Starting a difficult task is always worse than continuing it. So once you start, chances are you won't stop at 5 minutes.

If people are facing a daunting task (for example, recruiting new members), and their instinct is to avoid it, you've got to break down the task. Shrink the change. Make the change small enough (5 minutes of recruiting at a time) that they can't help but score a victory. Once people start to clean a single room (or recruit a single new member), their reluctance starts to dissipate, and their progress begins to snowball.

With the holidays upon us, a time that brings increased anxiety, depression and desperation for many of those for whom we care, now is the time to share the crisis prevention number: 988. For veterans, Press 1.

This crisis line is not only for veterans, though. Family members of in-crisis veterans can also call and press 1, and those in crisis themselves who are not veterans are also encouraged to dial those three numbers: 988.

Other extensions include pressing 2 for Spanish speakers and pressing 3 for those in LGBTQIA+ community under age 25; all other callers, remain on the line to be connected with a trained representative momentarily.

Even one loss to suicide is too many. Get help today.





Be An Advocate-Be Informed-Be Engaged

March General Information

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I hope everyone has been enjoying their winter, luckily for most of us it has been a mild one. In last month's general information I informed you that this newsletter would contain all the Legislative Victories for Veterans as well as upcoming bills that require action be taken via Action Corp. I am glad to say there were quite a few that passed legislation, below I have provided information on the bills that are being introduced to Congress along with the number and name of the bill along with a brief description of how it helps our veterans and their families.

S. 1975, the Discharge Review Board Accountability Act, would require a study on the compliance of military discharge review boards to follow statutory requirements related to the application of "liberal consideration" during the decision process for certain conditions. Liberal consideration standards relate to a review of discharge status and requests for correction of military records based on mental health conditions to include post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), sexual assault or sexual harassment. The report must cover seven key areas in determining if discharge review boards are using the liberal consideration standards required in their decision-making process. This legislation, S. 1975, is in accordance with DAV Resolution No. 113, which calls for a more liberal review of other than honorable (OTH) military discharges for the purpose of eligibility for Department of Veterans Affairs benefits and services in cases where veterans may have been suffering with PTSD, traumatic brain injury, or experienced military sexual trauma or harassment.

H.R. 2413, the Dental Care for Veterans Act. This bill would require the Secretary of the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) to furnish dental care in the same manner as any other medical service, and defines a 4-year implementation plan beginning with veterans in Priority Groups 1 and 2 (veterans with service-connected disabilities rated at 30% or more) in year one.

H.R. 3452, the Fred Hamilton Veterans' Lost Records Act, which would ensure veterans whose military records are lost by the U.S. government through no fault of their own can still receive their earned Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) benefits. After a 1973 fire at the National Personnel Records Center (NPRC) in St. Louis destroyed the records of nearly 16 million veterans, VA established a regulatory process for those affected that allowed veterans whose records were lost to use the next closest medical record or a buddy statement to meet the burden of proof required for VA health care and benefits. S. 3452 would expand that process to all veterans whose records were lost by the VA or the Department of Defense.

S. 3526, the Lactation Spaces for Veteran Moms Act, would require each VA medical center to create a lactation station for veterans who are nursing. As the number of women veterans using VA health care continues to grow, VA must ensure that it creates environments that are safe and welcoming to all veterans. This includes private, convenient and hygienic lactation stations that women can easily and safely access while they are obtaining the health care they have earned.

If you have not already taken action on the above bills please review your emails for ay DAV items requesting you take action.

Do not forget local and town elections take place this month so keep an eye out for voting dates this month and please remember to get out and vote!!!
